## **Eileen Rosaline O'Connor 19 February 1892 - 10 January 1921**

Born in Melbourne in 1892, Eileen suffered from a severe curvature of the spine and could not stand or walk for much of her life. It is now known Eileen suffered from transverse myelitis, an inflammation of the spinal cord.

Eileen embodied a distinctive spirituality marked by an unwavering devotion to Our Lady and her willingness to devote her suffering to Our Lady's work. Eileen's beautiful spirit inspired many people to seek her guidance and prayers. She listened to them, understood their problems and gave wise advice. There are numerous anecdotal and documented accounts of Eileen's intercession in answering the prayers of the faithful.

Eileen died on 10 January 1921, aged just 28 years. Her legacy - the mission of Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor over the past 113 years remains as important as ever. Assisted by the ongoing generosity of benefactors and volunteers, the Sisters continue to support the sick poor in Sydney. The work is also continued by 'The Brown Nurses,' an independent ministry of Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor.
